Minutes:

1. With a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 7:02pm by Tess Morris; seconded by Marty Kohlmeier.
2. Minutes from the November 6, 2013 meeting were approved; motion to approve by Tess Morris; seconded by Marty Kohlmeier. The minutes from the January 8, 2014 meeting were approved with changes to sentence structure and information on shoplifting; motion to approve by Tess Morris; seconded by Marty Kohlmeier. Compliments were made to Karl and Hank for their efforts in keeping the historical records of our meetings.
3. EMS
  - a. Carol Mullis spoke with Mr. Helms. They have entered into contract talks with Carolinas Health Care. He advised that EMS visibility will be increasing by being more visible at the fire stations and perhaps the Village hall. Regrettably there are no targeted implementation dates for the talks or the visibility.
  - b. It was mentioned that there has been a new EMS vehicle seen in the Village. This vehicle is a fire truck/EMS combination that will save on sending the fire trucks for true EMS calls.
  - c. We still have no EMS statistics available to us for the Village.
  - d. No information available on the number of Village citizens transported out of Wesley Chapel by EMS.
  - e. **Motion:** Raised by Carol Mullis that the Safety Committee submits to Council another request for the 2 acres of property adjacent to the 201

Central property for EMS use as was previously done between December 2012 and February 2013. Seconded by Hank Pressley.

4. Deputy
  - a. We had to table discussions regarding reports, crime statistics and activities until we can get additional information.
  - b. When does the clock start on the deputy's hours? It is believed to be when he enters his vehicle at the start of his day, regardless of the location.
  - c. All agreed that it should be easier than it is to gather reports, data and feedback. Councilwoman Kenary previously advised that she has a way to secure the data for the crime statistics requested by the Safety Committee. The statistics have not been received.
  - d. The 2014 budget for Safety, which includes the deputy's salaries and benefits, is set at \$81,496. Given the number of state troopers and other deputies seen in the Village there is concern as to whether or not we need a dedicated deputy.
  
5. National Night Out
  - a. A letter for donations is ready to go out to Aston Properties and the successor to JDH. There is a question as to whether or not we can use the same letter, with date changes, as that presented in 2013.
  - b. Jim Dale is working on getting other businesses involved and Mayor Horvath has advised of his availability to meet with businesses and vendors to support NNO.
  
6. New Business
  - a. The next council meeting is Monday, March 10th at 7:00pm. All are encouraged to attend these meetings if schedules permit.
  - b. A brief discussion was held regarding the security system and room accesses for committee meetings.
  - c. Tess publicly thanked Butch Plyler for his involvement and tenacity in seeing the town hall come to fruition despite budget cutbacks along the way.
  - d. A brief discussion was held about the status of the roads in the Village; i.e., what belongs to subdivision HOAs, what belongs to the county and what belongs to the state. At this point is believed that roads in existing subdivisions will be covered by the county; new subdivisions will have to cover their roads through their HOAs.
  - e. All are reminded that if they are not able to attend a meeting of the Safety Committee an e-mail is to be sent to Tess Morris and Becky Plyler in advance of the scheduled meeting.
  - f. There was also a brief discussion about recording nays and yeas when voting is required.
  
7. The next meeting will be May 7, 2014 at 7:00pm at the Wesley Chapel

Village Town Hall. The scheduled meeting dates for the remainder of the year are May 7, 2014; July 2, 2014; NNO on August 5, 2014; October 1, 2014 and December 3, 2014.

8. Motion to adjourn made by Tess Morris at 8:17pm; seconded by Marty Kohlmeier.
