Safety Committee Minutes
7:00PM, July 12, 2007**

The Safety Committee met in the Fellowship Hall of the Wesley Chapel United Methodist Church at 120 Potter Road South, Wesley Chapel North Carolina, with Councilman Brad Horvath presiding.


Minutes

Meeting was called to order at 6:55 PM and a quorum was present.

1. The Committee approved the 05.17.07 minutes. Motion by Pressley. Second by Morris. Motion approved.
2. The Committee discussed the next phase of the Committee's activities, which is to prepare recommendations and deliverables for the Village Council. The Committee identified three projects, which are to:
 - j Draft recommendations about how to support Neighborhood Watches in the Village.
 - j Draft options to consider for providing law enforcement service the Village population grows.
 - j Draft some emergency procedures recommended by the Homeland Security Director.
3. The Committee discussed the deliverables for the Village Council. The Committee reached a consensus that a two or three page deliverable was adequate. The Committee established a tentative schedule to prepare drafts for discussion at the September meeting and review and approval at the October meeting. The Committee divided into pairs to draft the deliverables. Morris and Maher will draft the recommendations for the Neighborhood Watches and National Night Out. Raughley and Pressley will draft the emergency procedures. Moran and Stoehr were assigned to draft the law enforcement options.
4. Morris provided more insights about the approaches to consider for supporting Neighborhood Watches and National Night Out. Her ideas will be summarized in the recommendations. Raughley announced that Marvin was hosting a National Night Out on August 7th.
5. Raughley reviewed the emergency procedures recommended by the Homeland Security Director, which were included in the 05.17.07 minutes. The Committee reached a consensus that incorporating by reference the Union County Emergency Operations Plan and preparing an addendum was the best approach. The Committee also discussed the possible drop-off points within the Village.

6. The Committee reached a consensus that the law enforcement options should address contracting for deputy patrols, public safety officers on patrol, and Village-provided police officers. Mullis added that the UCSD might be willing to provide deputy patrols at no cost if the Village could identify a satellite office, such as the new fire station being designed or within the new shopping center. The Committee agreed that this idea should be researched.
7. Horvath reported that the Village would consider a resolution to support a traffic light at the intersection of Waxhaw-Indian Trail Road and New Town Road.
8. No other announcements were made.
9. The meeting was adjourned at 7:42pm.
