Minutes:

1. With a quorum present, the meeting was called to order at 7:00pm by Tess Morris; seconded by Marty Kohlmeier.
2. Minutes from the July 10, 2013 meeting were reviewed. Motion to approve was made by Hank Pressley; seconded by Marty Kohlmeier.
3. The guests were welcomed.
4. Union County EMS)
  - a. Commissioner Helms spoke extensively about Union County EMS.
  - b. Mr. Helms and Commissioner Jonathan Thomas are reviewing the Union County EMS contract.
  - c. We should have a response-based contract.
  - d. The old contract has no requirements about staffing, etc.
  - e. Response times, how fast to the scene will be metrics in any new contract.
  - f. EMS is pushing for a 12-hour, not 24-hour, facility. The difference is that with a 12-hour facility any medications will be stored on the EMS vehicle, not at a facility. It was also noted that a 12-hour operation will negate the need for an EMS facility within Wesley Chapel.
  - g. Changes to any contract should include leaving the ambulances in the county for emergency coverage, not transporting patients to doctor appointments. At times, ambulances are in short supply in the County because of runs such as this or runs to hospitals outside of the County. Third party companies could possibly be used to transport patients in these instances.

- h. EMS is currently asking for four (4) more ambulances. It is felt four more may be required if the current practices and procedures remain. However, with a change in practices and procedures, four more may not be needed.
  - i. EMS response times are currently longer than other emergency responders.
  - j. EMS is currently plagued with moral issues, poor communication and no accountability.
  - k. Liability issues play a role in establishing any new EMS contract.
5. Crime Statistics
- a. Quick review of the August crime stats. Refer to the attached.
  - b. New deputy has been assigned to Wesley Chapel. However, there is no assigned weekend or evening coverage.
  - c. How is the crime recap being compiled? What is the source of the information.
  - d. Running a report showing any increase or decrease in crime.
  - e. A presentation should be made to Council based on the findings of the crime statistics.
  - f. A meeting with Aston and JDH could also help define the magnitude of crime and what can be done to reduce criminal activity.
6. National Night Out
- a. Tess extended a big "Thank You" to all who were able to participate.
  - b. We received an abundance of donations, over \$200 in cash contributions.
  - c. Despite the weather conditions, the turnout was excellent.
  - d. Businesses are already talking about donating for NNO 2014.
7. New Business
- a. Village-wide speed limit of 35mph. It's been reported that a village ordinance already exists for this. Current speed limit signs cannot be changed. Apparently the second request for a village-wide ordinance supersedes the original ordinance.
  - b. The 2013 remaining regularly scheduled Safety Committee meeting is currently scheduled to be held November 6, 2013, starting at 7:00pm and currently scheduled to be conducted at Wesley Chapel United Methodist Church.
8. The next meeting will be November 6, 2013 at 7:00pm at Wesley Chapel United Methodist Church.
